


Easily improve your travel photography

Why composition is the N1 way to easily improve your photos

The aim of composition is to **guide the eye of the viewer** through your picture and put emphasis on your subject. It is a **great storytelling tool** because it helps **convey certain emotions** in your pictures and gets your viewer's attention. Once you have their attention, they will listen to your story, become your fans and, ultimately, your clients.



Super tip

By paying attention to how you frame your subject, you can make it really stand out. This will help your audience really connect with your pictures and become your biggest fans!

Composition is one of the easiest and quickest ways to improve because it's **independent of gear, camera settings**, and all the other techy photography stuff.

There are **easy-to-follow rules** that you can use to start and then train your eyes to instinctively see beautiful compositions.

Rules of composition

Follow these well-established rules of composition to create stunning photos that will leave your viewer in awe.

I'm going to illustrate them with diagrams so you can **visually understand them**.

You'll see that **some rules are opposites of each other**.

Some scenes lend themselves to multiple compositions. It's your job to choose what rule to use to convey the emotion that you want.

Wanna step it up? **Combine multiple composition rules** in one image and watch how they make it stronger!


Best composition rules

1. Rule of thirds
2. Symmetry
3. Frame in frame
4. Fill the frame
5. Patterns and textures
6. Negative space
7. Minimalism
8. Rule of odds
9. Leading lines
10. "S" curves
11. Golden triangles




LET'S DIVE IN!





Rule of thirds: activate the grid and place your subject at the intersection of the lines or on the lines



Rule of thirds: place the horizon line either on the top line or bottom line of the grid



Rule of thirds: this creates a visually pleasing composition every time. It's a bulletproof way to frame your photos!



Symmetry: placing buildings and landmarks symmetrically on the grid is a great way to give them importance



Frame in frame: Use frames that you find in your environment to add layers and three-dimensionality



Frame in frame: Windows, tables, foliage, fences, arches etc all make for great natural frames



Fill the frame: don't leave any space around your subject. This will help it make it look more important.



Patterns and textures: fill the frame with repeating elements for a very impactful image



Patterns: a great way to capture details and create a more abstract picture. They're awesome as backgrounds too!



Negative space: Breathing space around your subject is an effective way to emphasize it and convey tranquillity

SICILY

With mild winters and sizzling summers, this island is southern Italy's microcosm: it's packed with historical cities, stunning coastlines, cultural wonders, and food to write home about.



Negative space: Leaving space will help you put text and graphics for magazine covers, articles, Pinterest, IG etc



Minimalism: less is more.



Rule of odds: An odd number of elements is always more pleasing to the eyes so aim for 3 or 5 main items



Rule of odds: This is a winning rule when photographing food! Use smaller elements to complement the main dish



Leading lines: paths, fences, rivers, roads etc make great lines to lead the eyes of the viewer to the subject



Leading lines: start your leading line from the edges of the frame towards the middle where you place your subject



S curves: a curve can guide the eyes from left to right through the whole image. Lines don't have to be physical!



Golden triangles: angle elements on either of the diagonals and place interest points at the intersections



Golden triangles: creates a composition that feels dynamic yet balanced (and it'll make you look like a pro)
